Anne Jones Joined as Cadet 23 in March 1980 until June 1981 and was posted to Guildford in September 1980. Became a police constable in June 1981 and undertook initial training at Ashford PTC.

On successful completion of her training Anne was posted to Reigate where she remained until February 1985 when she was married a police officer David Pratt and was then transferred to Caterham Sub-Division. She also served at Oxted.

Anne undertook the role of HOLMES trainer at HQ for 18 months until 1991 when she returned to Caterham Divisional Support Unit. In 1993 Anne joined Godstone Traffic until 2000 when she transferred back to Reigate becoming part of the Crime Desk team where she remained until 2004 when employed as a local intelligence officer.

In June 2008 Anne transferred to Northants Police where she remained until retirement after 30 years service in September 2011
